OUR TRAINING PROGRAMS



BRICKLAYER

Bricklayers prepare, lay brick and other masonry units to construct and repair structures such as walls, partitions, fireplaces and chimneys. They also lay or install fire brick or castable materials on commercial or industrial projects.

Bricklayers require 4 years of training, including a minimum 4,860 hours of technical training, on-the-job training and exam.

CARPENTER

Carpenters cut, shape and install building materials during the construction of buildings, bridges, concrete formwork, highway infrastructure and houses etc. They work with wood, vinyl, plastic and other materials to create the interior and exterior of structures.

Carpenters require 4 years of training, including 840 inschool training hours, 6,360 on-the-job training hours and exam.

CEMENT MASON / CONCRETE FINISHER

Concrete finishers/cement masons place, level and finish perishable concrete in various settings, including residential, commercial, industrial and institutional construction. They install overlayments and perform repairs to restore deteriorated surfaces, as well as install structural and machine base grouts.

Cement Masons require 3 years training, including 120 hours of technical training, 3,240 hours (minimum) of onthe-job training and exam.




CONSTRUCTION CRAFT WORKER

Construction craft workers work in industrial, commercial and institutional construction; road building; traffic control; pre-cast cement; rail maintenance; mining/ diamond drilling; tunneling and landscaping.

Construction Craft Workers require 2 years of training, including a minimum of 4,000 hours of on-the-job training. Each year includes four weeks (120 hours) of technical training.

CONSTRUCTION CAMP WORKER

Camp workers plan, prepare and serve meals and clean facilities in remote construction camps. Unite Here Local 40 has been representing camp workers for over 70 years.

DRYWALL FINISHER

A Drywall Finisher tapes and finishes wallboard (drywall), applies, maintains and restores plaster and similar materials on interior and exterior walls, ceilings and building partitions to make them more decorative soundproof and fire-rated. Drywall Finishers apply tapes, install decorative beads to protect corners, mixes and applies filling compounds and then sands them to create a smooth surface. A Drywall Finisher also textures concrete, applies coats of plaster to foundation materials, and installs, repairs and restores mouldings and ornaments.

ELECTRICIAN

Electricians lay out, assemble, install, test, troubleshoot and repair electrical wiring, fixtures, control devices and related equipment in buildings and other structures.

Electricians require 5 years of training, involving 9,000 hours of technical training and on-the-job training.

FLOORLAYER

Floor covering installers, also known as floorlayers, install all types of flooring materials, including carpet, sheet vinyl, tile, wood and laminates, and even sports surfaces. Floorlayers work in commercial, residential and institutional settings and install floor coverings in structures such as buildings, schools, hotels, homes and churches.

Floorlayers require 3 years training, including 5 weeks of technical training, 5,400 hours of on-the-job training and exam.

GASFITTER

A gasfitter is a person who installs, tests, maintains, and repairs gas lines, appliances, equipment and accessories in residential and commercial premises. Fuels may include natural gas, manufactured gas, liquefied petroleum gas, digester gas, landfill gas, biogas or a mixture or dilution of any of these gases and Hydrogen. A Class A gasfitter is involved in the installation or alteration of any gas system, except vehicle fuel systems, under an appropriate permit. A Class B fitter works on appliances and equipment that do not exceed 400 000 Btuh (British Thermal Units per hour) or 120 kW (kilowatts) such as boilers, burners, makeup air units, furnaces, process burners, and various other gas-fired equipment.

GLAZIER

Glaziers fabricate, install and repair commercial and residential window, door and entranceway systems.

Glaziers require 4 years of training including 6,400 hours of work-based training and 540 hours of technical training and exam.

HEAVY EQUIPMENT OPERATOR

Operating Engineers work as light and heavy equipment operators, crane operators, mechanics and welders in the construction, road building, paving, mining, marine, and oil and gas industries. PROGRAMS



Insulators apply, remove and repair thermal and acoustical insulation using a range of insulation materials (e.g., fibreglass, mineral wool, styrofoam, etc.) on all types of mechanical equipment, such as plumbing and piping

IRONWORKER

Ironworkers fabricate, erect, hoist, install, repair and service structural ironwork, pre-cast concrete, concrete reinforcing materials, curtain walls, ornamental iron, and other metals used in the construction of buildings, bridges, highways, dams and other structures and equipment.

Ironworker generalist require 4740 hours and 3 levels of training, Ironworker Reinforcing Require 3180 hours and 2 levels of training.

MILLWRIGHT

Millwrights install, service, diagnose and repair stationary machinery and heavy equipment used in many industries. They work on a range of equipment such as pumps, compressors, turbines and mining equipment using a combination of hand and power tools, including welding equipment.

Millwrights require technical training, on-the-job training and exam.

PAINTER-DECORATOR

Painters/Decorators apply decorative and protective finishes in commercial, institutional and industrial settings. They prepare a variety of surfaces (wood, masonry, drywall, plaster, concrete, synthetics, stucco and metal) prior to the application of materials such as paint, high performance coatings, waterproofing, fireproofing, varnish, shellac, wall coverings, and specialty finishes.

Painter and Decorators require 3-4 years training; including 5,400 work-based training and 540 hours of technical training and exam.

PILEDRIVERS AND BRIDGEWORKER

Piledrivers and Bridgeworkers install pipes and poles vertically deep into the ground to support buildings of all sizes. On the roads and highways, they construct overpasses and bridges. In the water, they build structures under the sea, from container ship docks to ferry terminals. Piledrivers and Bridgeworkers require 3 years training, including 3 levels of technical training and 3,600 hours of work-based training under supervision in the trade. Apprentices are awarded a Certificate of Qualification after completing everything.

PLUMBER

Plumbers install, alter, and repair potable water, waste disposal and hydronic heating systems. They read and interpret blueprints and project specifications. They select the type and size of pipe required for a project and measure, shape, and join pipes according to the specifications.

Plumbers require 4 years of training; including 6,300 hours of work-based training, 900 hours of technical training and exam.

ROOFER/ SHINGLER

Roofers and shinglers install, repair, and replace flat roofs and shingles, shakes and other roofing tiles on residential, industrial, and commercial buildings.

Roofers require 3 years training; including 360 hours of technical training, 3,600 hours work-based training and exam.

REFRIGERATION MECHANIC

Refrigeration mechanics work in the residential, commercial and industrial sectors installing, commissioning, servicing and maintaining air-conditioning and heat pump systems, supermarket refrigeration, process refrigeration systems and everything in between.

Refrigeration mechanics require 4 years training, including 990 hours of technical training, 6,210 hours of on-the-job training, and exam.

SHEET METAL WORKER

Sheet metal workers lay out, fabricate, assemble, weld, install and service a variety of projects such as HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning), industrial, kitchen and hospital equipment, and architectural work. A Sheet Metal Worker requires highly specialized and up-to-date skills to accomplish the various tasks involved in the trade.

Sheet metal workers require 4 years training; including a preapprenticeship of up to 1,600 hours followed by four levels of 6-week technical training sessions and 6,400 hours in the industry.

SPRINKLER FITTER

Sprinkler fitters fabricate, install, test, maintain, inspect and repair sprinkler systems on industrial, commercial and residential job sites. They install wet- and drypipe, preaction, and deluge sprinkler systems, as well as carbon dioxide, chemical, and foam extinguishing systems, stand pipe and hose systems, and fire pumps.

Sprinkler fitters require 4 years of training; including 6,480 hours of work-based training, 720 hours of technical training and exam.




SIEAMFIIIER

Steamfitters/pipefitters use blueprints and project specifications to construct, fabricate, install, and repair piping systems that carry water, steam, chemicals, and fuel and specialize in systems that move liquids or gases under high pressure.

Steamfitter/pipefitters require 4 years of training; including 6,300 hours of work-based training, 900 hours of technical training and exam.

TEAMSTER

Teamsters drive a wide variety of vehicles such as articulated rock trucks, cat wagons, boom trucks, water trucks, buses, transit mixers, low beds, etc.

Teamsters require drivers certification, equipment and safety training.

TILESETTER

Tilesetters cover interior and exterior walls, floors and ceilings with ceramic, marble and quarry tile, mosaics, or terrazzo.




WALL & CEILING INSTALLER

Wall & ceiling installers frame interior walls and install window frames, doors, partitions and computer floors. They hang drywall, T-bar ceilings and suspended ceilings.

Wall & ceiling installers require 4 years of training including 6,000 hours of work-based training and 540 hours of technical training hours and exam.

WELDER

A welder is a person who has training in and is capable of welding ferrous and nonferrous metals. Using various welding processes, welders will weld in flat, horizontal, vertical, and overhead on both plate and/ or pipe. Welders interpret blueprints, fabricate, construct and repair different components of various structures. A logbook is used throughout a welders career to record training, competencies, certifications, endorsements, and employment history.

Many of our school offer welding programs.
